to
PHILLIP & RETA (WITHAM) THEBARGE




For decades, Reta and Phillip Thebarge have been low-profile pillars of the community. In their own quiet way, they saw things that needed to be done in the community or in the organizations that they were involved with and just did them. They didn't have to be asked, and they shied away from being celebrated. The scope of their community service has ranged from the Norridgewock Historical Society (NHS) to the Village Improvement Society ("The VI"), to the Norridgewock Cemetery Committee, to remembering our veterans, and more.

A few highlights of their service:

- For years Reta and Phillip have been strong supporters of NHS. Reta served as secretary for many years and held other executive positions over time. Her comprehensive meeting records and scrapbooks are invaluable *forever* research resources for the preservation of our town history. For his part, NHS insiders recognize Phillip as the go-to person for information on past 70-plus years of town history. His memory for town history, places, and events is like a steel trap. If you need to know something, don't Google, ask Phillip.
- When NHS purchased the Museum building, there were numerous clean-up and restoration tasks that had to be completed before the Museum could open its doors to the public. Reta and Phillip jumped right in and became an integral part of the team. Besides time spent scraping, sanding, patching, painting, and more, the Thebarges undertook their

own special labor of love. Together, they built a large walk-in cedar closet (7 x 8 feet, or so) to store the Museum's collection of military uniforms donated by local veterans. Akin to this project, for a number of years, they set up the military display featured at the NHS open house after the Memorial Day parade. At right, Reta on the *Project 2000* Parade Float.



- In addition to NHS, Reta has had leadership roles in The VI, with a special interest in The VI Scholarship for Norridgewock graduates. As she did for NHS, her VI record keeping and scrapbooking are *forever* resources. As a fundraiser, she had a huge following at VI bake sales on Election Day and Oosoola Days; most notably were her homemade pies and whoopie pies.



While Phillip didn't bake, he was always the set-up guy, carting tables and goods to the gym or the park; he stood by to help as needed. (Reta and her sister-in-law Lucille LaPlante baked, and their husbands were the support crew, and were probably willing taste-testers, too! Shown to the left, Phillip, Emile and Lucille LaPlante, and Reta at an Oosoola Days bake sale.

- For years Phillip took it upon himself to maintain the grounds at the Museum and, tied to The VI, for a long time he was the one behind the scenes that saw to it that there were plants at the Town Office and flowers at the Veterans Monument.
- Another area of Reta's volunteer commitments is our cemeteries. She was one of a five-member volunteer Cemetery Committee that updated the Cemetery Ordinance and had signs made for all 11 of our cemeteries a few years ago.

About the Thebarges:

PHILLIP. Phillip Thebarge was born in Cornville but grew up on a farm in Smithfield. He was the fourth of seven children (5 girls and 2 boys), born to John and Yvonne Thebarge. Phillip, who was the oldest son, left school at an early age to help support the family.

It was not all work for Phillip, however. Along the way, he met Reta Witham at the Smithfield Roller Rink...

RETA. Reta was the first daughter and second-oldest child of the four children (2 girls and 2 boys) born to Alford and Arlene Witham (It is worth noting that, like their daughter Reta, they were civic minded. At one point, Alford was both the Town Manager of Norridgewock and Smithfield's First Selectman, and for years, Arlene was Town Treasurer in Smithfield). The Witham family's local roots go back to Jeremiah Witham, a Revolutionary War soldier from East Pond Plantation.



Although born in Norridgewock, Reta's early years were spent in Plainville, Connecticut, where her father worked for the Marlin-Rockwell Corporation (ball bearing manufacturer). Alford worked hard and saved enough money to buy a place on the East Pond Plantation near the old family farm. The photo above shows Reta on the left, with her sister Maralyn during the Plainville years.



Reta and family moved back to Maine in 1947. She graduated from Skowhegan High School in June 1952, and married Phillip in September of the same year. Shortly after they were married, Phillip began his two years of service in the United States Army. He was assigned to Co. I, 223rd Infantry Regiment, 40th Infantry Division, and served in Korea for a year. Among his decorations: Combat Infantry Badge, Korean Service Medal with Bronze Service Star, United Nations Service Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal.

After Phillip was discharged from the Army, the couple lived in a Main Street apartment near the old fire station, and Phillip began his career in the shoe-making business (He retired from New Balance in 1996). In those early days, Reta ran what today would be considered a daycare center, but back then was

simply called babysitting. Later, she worked as a waitress at Whittemore's, then in the office at Norrwock Shoe. When they closed, she worked at the Skowhegan Federal Credit Union until her retirement in 1998.


In 1958, they bought their first home (on Mercer Road) and have lived there ever since. Phillip's sister Bernadette and her family lived next door, and his parents John and Yvonne were across the street. All the Thebarger/Witham siblings and their families were close and built many fond memories together. When the shoe shops were closed in July, there were multi-family camping trips to places like Washington, DC and Virginia, New Hampshire, and Connecticut. On the weekends, they went off to Abnaki Campground in Madison. At one point, some members from several different generations took up square dancing and went anywhere there was a dance. Of course, there were also the Little League years. Phillip coached the Braves, and his two boys played for the Red Sox (Reta undoubtedly cheered for both teams!).



Phillip and Reta have four children, five grandchildren, and nine great-grands! Plus, (the late) Tommy, a long-lived cat of some notoriety.

At the 2024 Town Meeting, the Norridgewock Select Board recognized **David Obert** with the Town of Norridgewock's Spirit of America Award for his remarkable volunteerism in the community. Joining the Select Board in recognizing David were Town Manager Richard LaBelle and State Representative Jack Ducharme.

David Obert is a young member of our community who has gone to great lengths over the last few years to get deeply involved and give back with his time and talent. As a member of the Maine Antique Tractor Club, he is involved in many of their events and activities, giving his time and equipment to improve the club's Norridgewock property. He has also shared this passion with the public by offering free hayrides behind his antique tractor during the Norridgewock Holiday Stroll, and he's been a fixture in the lighted tractor parade.



As a part of the family business, DMO Landscaping, David has also been helpful with the Norridgewock Historical Society's Duck Drop, as he volunteers to operate the loader to drop the ducks; this supports one of the organization's major annual fundraising efforts. He is also very involved with the Norridgewock Sportsmen Association. He has spent countless hours on trail maintenance and has further stepped up to assume the role of Snowmobile Trailmaster, and now President.

David's work is inspiring to anyone who sees it, and it is especially encouraging knowing that he is of the next generation to lead the community.

About Spirit of America: The Spirit of America Foundation tribute was first presented to Alma Jones by the City of Augusta in 1991. Counties and municipalities across the State of Maine join with the foundation to recognize exceptional volunteerism within the community. In Norridgewock, nominees are considered by the Select Board and the award is presented each year at Town Meeting.

SELECT BOARD & TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Norridgewock continues to make strides in responsible development and modernization with great consideration given to preserving our rich rural, historic, and agricultural history. Our projects and investments continue to focus on building a stronger community through tax base expansion and general economic development. We appreciate the support of the public in these endeavors, and we value Town staff and the many volunteers that work to bring projects to fruition. The Town remains in good financial health, and we've worked to keep taxes low—some of the lowest in the region.

Emergency Management. Moving into 2024, we were focused on recovering from the December 2023 storm that brought flooding and power outages to town. The response was swift; however, it can always improve. We implemented a new notification system that alerts the public about a variety of topics, including river levels, roadwork, emergencies, town operations, etc. You can sign up to receive these alerts by text or email at www.norridgewock.gov/notify. We also authorized the purchase of an enclosed trailer to be used to support emergency management efforts. The trailer is used for elections, as well, to ensure it isn't just something that sits idle. Aside from the new side-by-side trailer, it is the only enclosed cargo transportation the Town has, so it provides unique value, especially during a storm. We remain committed to being proactive and responsive in emergency situations.

Communication. In addition to the new text alert system, voters also approved expanding the distribution of the Town newsletter, *The Bridge*. The newsletter is now printed and mailed direct to every door in Norridgewock. It is mailed four times per year and provides ready access to relevant Town news. If you would like to contribute to the newsletter, please reach out to the Town Office. We welcome writing or photos of general interest, showcasing your organization, or highlighting people or groups in our community. We continue to stream all our meetings online, and they are usually available the next day on YouTube, something that encourages public engagement and information in local government.

Marijuana. In the dead cold of winter, the Somerset County Sheriff's Office descended on Norridgewock raiding several residential properties for illegal marijuana operations. The first raid was in February, and they continued periodically over the next few months. Town staff were cooperative with these searches and assisted when requested. These raids were so unusual and relatively unexpected in Central Maine, it attracted national news crews to Norridgewock as they explored the impact on communities and the ties to Chinese organized crime. As always, we are grateful to law enforcement for being proactive in our community.

Rail Trail Opening. In June, we formally celebrated the opening of the Kennebec Valley Trail (multi-use rail trail). We were joined by representatives from the State of Maine, Mid-Maine Chamber of Commerce, local sporting groups, and outdoor enthusiasts, as the ribbon was cut on the south side of the Kennebec. It was only appropriate that there be a modest ceremony recognizing all the hard work that so many people put in to make the rail conversion a reality.

Tax-Acquired Property. The State continued to pivot and change rules related to the disposal of tax-acquired property (properties that are foreclosed on for the non-payment of taxes). The changes in process have delayed our ability to release our interests. The Town took ownership of 13 Wade Street through the non-payment of sewer use charges. This was a property that had a burned building that the former owner declined to mitigate. The Town cleaned up the property and will recoup its expenses when the property is sold or redeemed. *The new statute does not allow for tax-acquired properties to go out to bid as they once did; they must be offered to the previous owner for redemption and sold by a realtor.*

The End of an Era: New Balance. New Balance officials announced in July that they would be shifting all Norridgewock operations to their newly expanded facility in Skowhegan, beginning this winter and concluding in mid-2025. The announcement came as a relative shock, as it was previously noted that the new facility in Skowhegan was not intended to absorb the Norridgewock facility. We have been working closely with New Balance officials, area economic development agencies, and potential investors to ensure this property is not left as a vacant liability to the Town. We remain optimistic about the potential and are grateful for the many years of community support and involvement that New Balance has dedicated to the Town of Norridgewock. While it appears that shoe manufacturing in Norridgewock will come to an end, we remain optimistic knowing that the jobs are not being eliminated.

New Property. Voters approved the purchase of a parcel of land on Mercer Road, adjacent to Mill Stream Elementary. While small, the lot represents great potential for responsible development. The Board and staff worked diligently to ensure significant public involvement in the process for idea development. The two prevailing concepts were developing pickleball courts or constructing a library. At present time, the Board is working with the Library Trustees and resident Fred Marshall (who is very generously volunteering his time to develop a proposed building layout and site plan) to bring forth a more concrete plan for voters to consider, with a target date of June.

Safety. Over the last year, we have been working to enhance safety in all municipal areas. This includes the installation of surveillance equipment on many Town-owned properties, as well as the development of new safety programs internally. Our employee-driven Safety Committee has been active in reviewing each Town-owned facility and providing recommendations for safer operations. They are also working to introduce new safety initiatives that encourage safer workplaces which, in turn, help reduce insurance rates. As always, we strive to ensure that every employee leaves the workplace in the same or better condition than when they arrived.

Membership. We welcomed new member Cheyenne Goodrich to the Board in March. She quickly acclimated to the Board but was forced to resign in May when she and her family moved outside of Norridgewock. Through a special election in July, Chuck Farrand was seated. Thank you to Cheyenne for her willingness to serve our community, even if just for a short while.

Proposed Community Event & Engagement Position. At the recommendation of the Recreation and Parks Committees, we explored the development of a new position that provides programming oversight and helps meet needs within the Town. A job description was reviewed by the Board, then referred to a volunteer working group for further review. The result is a proposed full-time position that would help support Parks and Recreation while organizing and executing community programs for all. They would help spearhead community events (current and expanded) and support municipal operations through oversight of municipal property maintenance. Our Board recommends the creation and funding of this position. Our proposal for 2025 is to fund the position at 75%, given that the position won't be filled for the entire year. The budgetary request for voters to consider by secret ballot referendum (during the day and absentee voting) is \$48,000, which translates to a position that would ultimately cost \$63,000 if funded for a full 12 months.

Thank you. Thank you to our Town board and committee members, coaches, firefighters, and those working with the many local non-profits. You are appreciated, and you are what makes Norridgewock such a great place to live and recreate. We respect your trust in us for another year, and the pleasure of serving the Town.

Absentee ballot requests for Town Meeting and the Presidential Primary were available in late 2023, the rest is history. Election work starts at least 90 days before an election, so you can tell from the chart above that 2024 was non-stop. In addition to the traditional elections operations, staff continued to train on automatic voter registration (through BMV), then the State tossed in online voter registration. A new voter registration database system was supposed to be introduced, but the State never rolled it out. A sincere thanks to our office staff for their elections support, and to our voters; thanks for your ongoing support and patience.

Our poll workers have been amazing, and we are grateful for their willingness to serve: Gloria Frederick, Kristina Gossman, Liz Hilton, Brenda Holt, Brandi Ireland, Becky Ketchum, Jean Lancaster, Heidi Lyman, Peter Lyman, Linda Quimby, Mary-Ellen Wallace, and Kelly-Ann Withee. In addition to our elections staff, we always want to thank Mill Stream Elementary School (especially Mr. Rodrigue, Ms. Moore, and Mr. Bitgood), Superintendent Moody, Somerset County Sheriff's Office, and Norridgewock Public Works for their support of safe and efficient elections.

As of December 31, 2024, there were 2,694 registered voters (+135 versus previous year) in Norridgewock, with the following party affiliations:



2024 REPORT OF THE NORRIDGEWOCK FIRE DEPARTMENT



We are proud to submit the 2024 annual report of the Norridgewock Fire Department.

2024 was another very active and successful year for the department. We responded to over **248** total calls for service. The call total is somewhat down from 2023; however, it still represents an increasing trend line over time (dashed red line)



PERSONNEL

2024 included several personnel changes within the department.

- Veteran call-force firefighter **Daryl Wyman** was promoted to Deputy Chief and hired to fill the part-time position of Department Administrator. We are grateful for Daryl's long-term dedication to Norridgewock Fire.
- 30-year member **Jeffrey Jones** was promoted to the position of Captain. Jeff continually leads by example. His leadership is respected by all members & appreciated by the administration.
- Full-time firefighters **Andrew Dexter** and **Kyle Mullin** were both promoted to the position of Lieutenant. Having their enthusiastic leadership at the fire station on a daily basis benefits us all. Their dedication to continuous improvement is noticed and appreciated.
- Firefighters **Dawson Pelotte** and **Brandon Wyman** joined our ranks in 2024. We are grateful for their dedication to the towns of Norridgewock and Mercer. In addition, Dawson earned his FF1 & FF2 certification in 2024.
- Former Chief **David Savage**, firefighters **Megan Jones**, & **Andrew Pineo**, and paramedic **Dan Greaney** left the department in 2024. We wish them well and thank them for their years of service.

We are thankful to each of these firefighting professionals for their dedication, sacrifice, and service to protect the people and property of Norridgewock and Mercer.

TRAINING

Our Training Committee is led by veteran Firefighter **Ryan Jones**, and includes Lieutenants **Mullin & Dexter**, and Firefighter **Randy Murray**. The committee has developed an ambitious plan to increase valuable department training and the corresponding training budget in 2025. We look forward to the learning challenges the committee puts forward each month.

MAJOR PROJECTS

The major project in 2024 was to purchase & equip a new Side-by-Side. Project funding was primarily from the Estate of **Alice E. Emery**, but also included some critical funding from the Somerset County Community Benefit TIF fund & the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Accordingly, this \$75,000 project was accomplished without any funding from local property taxes!

The new equipment replaced our 2002 4-wheeler and supports emergency incidents on the expanded Kennebec Valley Trail and other remote locations throughout Norridgewock and Mercer. Purchases included the following:

- 2024 Polaris Ranger XP1000 Northstar side-by-side with enclosed cab
- Kimtek Research UTV combination firefighting and rescue skid
- Nitro 16' enclosed cargo trailer & electric trailer dolly
- Miscellaneous equipment including stokes basket

To compliment the new equipment purchased, a wintertime rescue skid was expertly fabricated with labor donated by Captain **Jeffrey Jones** and Firefighter **Ryan Jones**. This skid supports the use of the Stokes basket and includes a paramedic transport seat, critical for tending to & rescuing victims in remote areas.

The side-by-side and enclosed trailer were appropriately lettered with the following graphic:



At the conclusion of the project, old department equipment was retired from service and either transitioned to another town department or offered for sale via competitive bid. This resulted in generating **\$8,800** to be dedicated to future department projects.

FIRE SAFETY

- Having multiple working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in your home is critical to your family's safety. The risk of dying in a home fire is **cut in half** in homes with working smoke alarms. If you have any questions, or need assistance, please contact the Fire Department at 22 Upper Main Street in Norridgewock or call 634-2208.
- Per Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §9324, sub-§: "A person who kindles or uses a recreational campfire may not allow the recreational campfire to **exceed 3 feet in diameter on the ground at the base of the fire or 3 feet in height**." If the fire exceeds that size, then a burn permit is required. We issue burn permits at the fire station free of charge & subject to weather conditions. Property owners can also obtain free permits online from Maine Forest Service at www.maineburnpermit.com.

CONCLUSION



WASTEWATER TREATMENT DEPARTMENT REPORT

We have just completed our fifth year of operation since starting up after our substantial plant upgrade. As of now, everything is running well, and all our state reports and inspections have had a positive outlook. The plant should continue to run well if we stick to our current maintenance schedule.

Maintenance includes checking all pumps, cleaning when necessary, checking and inspecting blowers, oil, grease, belt tension, clean air filters, and changing oil every 6,000 hours. All valves are exercised and greased quarterly. The clarifier is washed and scrubbed weekly, and oil is checked on a monthly basis. Once a year, we drain the clarifier completely for a thorough cleaning and to inspect all parts. We clean all valve pits and splitter boxes every six months, before and after chlorination season. The chlorine contact chamber is cleaned monthly to ensure clean effluence discharging back into the river. Pump stations are checked every other day and floats and transducers are cleaned monthly to ensure proper operation. We also check and inspect the generators and test them under load to guarantee they will be ready in emergency situations.

In 2024, power was out at the plant four times for a total of 12 hours, and we deployed the portable generator five times for a total of 31 hours, most of those hours were spent at the Rebecca Street pump station.

2024 by the numbers, the average flow through the plant was 70,900 gallons a day for a total of 25,873,000 gallons for the year. This is roughly up 1% over last year's flows. During the treatment process, we removed 98% of all organic solids coming into the plant by screening and settling. During this process, the effluent biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) levels averaged 6.3 mg/l, with a removal rate of 98%. Effluence total suspended solids (TSS) levels averaged 5.4 mg/l with a removal rate of 98%. Our license requires BOD and TSS levels of 30 mg/l, with a minimum removal rate of 85%. E coli bacteria monthly average was 8.0 colonies per 100 ml (col/100), compared to a limit of 64 col/100.

The solids removed during the treatment process are in the form of sludge. This sludge is hauled to Anson-Madison Sanitary District for final dewatering. They screen and dewater the sludge in their press. The press produces a dry cake which is trucked back to Waste Management for final disposal. This year, Stanley's Septic hauled 31 loads to Madison, for a total of 124,000 gallons.

Paul Everett of IT4ME installed security cameras at the plant to supplement our existing intrusion/fire alarm system. This will help protect our investment here at the plant. We can now remotely keep a watchful eye on the facility. These cameras were funded through a risk management grant.



TDS Telecom ran a new fiber-optic line into the plant, this came in underground over 1,000 feet. This line will allow the plant to have high-speed internet, providing us with the ability to run our SCADA (supervisory control and data acquisition) system. This system



lets us monitor and control the plant remotely with a laptop. We can acknowledge and/or clear alarms, as well as make adjustments to the process at night or on the weekends when the plant isn't normally manned.

We are having ongoing issues at the Rebecca Street pump station with rags and other items getting stuck in the system and plugging up the grinder pumps. Photos of these unfortunate events are shown to the right and on the previous page. These items are not okay to flush, and they cause down time and extra maintenance at the pump station. This year, we had to pull the pumps three times at a cost of \$1,800.00 to have the pumps cleaned at a cost to the rate/tax payers.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT REPORT

Like many, we entered 2024 continuing to clean up from the December floods that left us with a tremendous mess. We had to manage the cleanup of trees and other debris, while we were also called in to do the work of Maine DOT. We spent days removing mud and silt from the River Road to make it passable. Our cleanup efforts were swift but made greatly possible through the support of many private contractors who stepped up to help with labor and equipment. We appreciate the willingness of Norridgewock's small business owners to stand up and help out our community!

In early April, we experienced a big wind and rainstorm that closed roads with downed trees and power lines. This storm resulted in access to Winding Hill Road being closed for nearly three days. In instances like this, we are grateful for the public's patience and appreciation for safety.

As spring approached, we chipped away at some overdue projects on the list. The upper yard at the garage was cleaned up. We moved materials and removed overgrown vegetation to make the space more productive. We spent time in the garage making improvements recommended by the Safety Committee to ensure that we provide a safe place for employees to work.

One of our major focuses in the department through the summer months is the maintenance of gravel roads. We got the grader out and put a good crown on our dirt roads, allowing water to run off. We cleaned out ditches in numerous places where it stopped or drastically slowed flows. We completed shoulder work on Winding Hill, Sunset Hill, Bigelow Hill, Sandy River, Tarbell Hill, Oak Hill, Bombazee, Beech Hill, and Wilder Hill, all in an effort to ensure that water makes an efficient way to the ditches without damaging the road surface.

We installed a number of culverts this last season, some cross culverts, and some driveways. We installed culverts on Burrill Hill, Tarbell Hill, Beech Hill, and Frederick Corner. The department also dedicated time to clearing debris and overgrowth from intersections and around signage, to enhance safety.

There are a lot of maintenance items that we take care of throughout the town, as well. We ensure the downtown stays clean (with the generous support from Waste Management and their street sweeper), trash removal, dock installation at Oosoola Park, spreading woodchips on the playground, sweeping intersections, mowing the old dump at the foot of Winding Hill, pressure washing municipal buildings, among many other items.

In cooperation with the Sportsmen Association and the State of Maine, we received a grant to retrofit the Ford pickup truck with a calcium tank. The primary purpose for the tank is for application on the rail trail, but it can also be used for local roads. When we allocate resources to the trail, the State reimburses the Town for all costs incurred (because the Sportsmen Association provides volunteer hours as the local match).

Voters were gracious to approve the purchase of a new multi-use maintenance machine (MultiHog CX MK II) that was voted on in July. This machine will enhance our sidewalk maintenance efforts, especially once the sidewalks are reconstructed and extended. It will also allow us to complete roadside mowing internally. Also related to enhancing our downtown's maintenance, the Select Board supported the resurfacing of municipal parking lots on Main Street. The project included some excavation, leveling, and surface work. By completing these lots in 2024, we preempted work planned along Route 2 this year and next.



With the support of the Road Committee (thanks, Mike, Skip, and Jeff!), and the Select Board, we have been able to complete more capital roadwork this last year, and we're looking to have more work done in 2025. In 2024, bank stabilization projects were completed on Sandy River and Father Rasle. In 2025, we are looking to have work done on Wilder Hill and at the intersection of Smithfield, Perkins, Mechanic, and Martin Stream. We're also planning (and hopefully moving forward) to pave Bigelow Hill and consider layout adjustments to Ferry Road. We've also had the soils sampled on Outer Beech Hill, George, and Independence. Paving these outlying, short sections of road will help ease our maintenance burden and save significant time and cost. We're able to get additional work done with the support of funding from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, that was secured by Senator Collins, and is being managed by our engineering firm, Haley Ward.

We'd like to also take a moment to thank Andy Leavitt, one of our seasonal call drivers, who has been an important part of our winter road maintenance. Also, thanks to Walter Booker for his willingness to take on part-time work to help out around the garage with vehicle and equipment maintenance.



CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER REPORT



Dear Residents of Norridgewock,

As we wrap up another year of keeping the town in tip-top shape (or at least making sure it doesn't turn into a tip-top disaster), I present to you the highlights from the Code Enforcement Department's yearly adventures, mishaps, and occasional triumphs.

A Year of Strictly "Not-So-Strict" Enforcement.

When it comes to enforcing codes in our beloved town, we always strive for the perfect balance: ensuring safety and order, while still maintaining that charming, rustic chaos we all know and love. We've had some *interesting* calls this year, ranging from "My neighbor's tree is a *little* too close to my fence" to "is that a barn or a house?" Rest assured, we've handled it all with grace, diplomacy, and only occasional confusion.

Highlights:

- **Residential Construction:** 77 permits
- **Plumbing Permits:** 54 permits
- **Illegal Junkyards:** 45. We should get an award, right?

But the real stars of our report? Well, junk. Whether it's illegal junkyards or simply things that "might not technically be junk" (but totally are), we've worked hard to keep things, shall we say, "well-organized" around here. So, without further ado, let's dive into the year's highlights.

Ah, the illegal junkyard. That beautiful blend of tires, half-broken vehicles, and "one day I'll fix this, I swear" items. The year saw its fair share of these unsanctioned automotive treasures scattered throughout the town. But fear not! We've been on the case, keeping our eyes peeled for those who love to "collect" one too many engines and transmissions.

Highlights:

- **Illegal Junkyard Complaints:** 45 complaints filed (give or take a few anonymous tips). Thank you, good citizens, for your vigilance. We understand that you love your neighbor's vintage car collection (from 1982), but we understand you also don't want to look at broken down vehicles.
- **Successful Cleanup:** We were able to work with 11 property owners who realized that maybe, just maybe, the 13th car was *not* a "vintage collectible." Those 7 cars are now gone, and the "driveway" looks like—dare I say it—a driveway again.

The "Hidden Treasure" Myth:

We love when residents describe their collection of "rustic vehicles" as "hidden treasures." While we admire their optimism, we must inform you that, while buried treasure might involve gold, unlicensed junkyards usually involve more tires, old washing machines, and a *distinct* odor. Sorry, folks, but there's no buried pirate ship under those old refrigerators!

Conclusion:

"Norridgewock: The Heart of Maine's Crossroads"



Operationally, things remained relatively quiet at the airport this last year. We've continued to project plan for the future, with the assistance of State and Federal funds covering 95% of major projects. As we close out 2024, we await the arrival of a new snowblower that will go on our large tractor. The new snowblower is a Kodiak LMHD 3036, which cuts through up to 44 inches of snow and casts up to 100 feet. This is an important piece of equipment, in terms of snow removal, but also an absolutely vital tool in maintaining safe runways. It's been over two years trying to acquire this equipment as the result of product specifications and the FAA's Buy American Preference Requirements.



We've continued to tailor our grant applications to try and secure funding for a new terminal building. The grant award process is very competitive, but we remain committed to reviewing feedback on applications and continuing to apply. Our terminal building is aged and could certainly use a drastic improvement to strengthen its support for pilots, passengers, students, and the public at large.

The next large project we're exploring at the airport is the upgrade of runway lighting. This project proposes replacing the antiquated equipment and transitioning all of the lighting to LED. The project will be funded through the FAA and MaineDOT, but we're also exploring options to partner with Efficiency Maine for the upgrade. It may not be possible, but it is a responsible step to ensure we've exhausted potential funding mechanisms.

The Maine Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) conducted soil tests at the airport this fall in two major areas. There were 28 core samples that were drawn and tested for PFAS and any other potential contaminant. "The results indicate that the samples collected from [the airport] do not exceed the [Remedial Action Guidelines] for the residential exposure scenario. This means that ingestion, skin contact, and inhalation of soil or dust with concentrations below the RAGS are not expected to cause adverse health risks." Additionally, DEP conducted water tests on the property for the presence of PFAS and they returned below 20ng/L for the six PFAS compounds; as such, there is no

required treatment or concern at this time. These are important findings given the history of land spreading at the airport.



In September, the airport had what is likely the biggest showing for Oosoola Days ever. The bluebird skies were ideal for pilots to join us from all across the state, and it allowed hundreds of people the opportunity to get in planes for a ride up and over Norridgewock. The airport provides a wonderful space for these types of community activities, and it also

provides an opportunity for us to showcase the airport and its value to the community. The Parks Committee, Bruce Hurley, together with Ken and Brenda Morgan were remarkably instrumental in making Oosoola Days Sunday the success that it was—thank you!

Lastly, we take a moment to recognize and honor late Airport Advisory Committee member Howie Soule who passed away May 14. He took great pride in our airport, volunteered time to support airport operations, and truly cared about sharing his passion of aviation. We appreciate his service and dedication to KOWK.





Some of our guests this year: popular Maine author Gerry Boyle, Maine children's author Tamra Wight, resident and artist Cheryl Storer who held an art show in the summer and a holiday ornament painting class for adults in November, Mark Reifs Schneider with the Somerset Beekeepers Club, Maine children's author Jeanine Deas, and Maine author Retired Brigadier General Greg Smith.

Offsite Events: The library once again sponsored Mr. Drew & His Animals Too at the airport during Oosoola Days. By popular demand, Mr. Drew will be back in 2025, too! In December, we held our 3rd Annual Wreath-Making Workshop in partnership with the Grange.

Many thanks to our Friends of the Library people, with extra stars for our above and beyond friends who have spent countless hours helping Kelli with the children's programs: Becky Adams, Sharon Adams, and Gloria Nicholson. CEMETERY COMMITTEE REPORT

The Norridgewock Cemetery Committee moved forward on its previously identified needs in our eleven cemeteries by attending a headstone maintenance and cleaning workshop in New Sharon, sponsored by the Maine Old Cemetery Association. The Committee also approved a Request for Proposals for repair of broken, leaning, and dangerous stones. After investigating a number of options in and out of state, the Committee selected Grave Stone Matters, an Upstate New York company that specializes in old stone repairs, to repair some of the most serious issues in Riverview Cemetery, including two broken veterans' stones. A dangerous stone in Oak Cemetery was also evaluated and deemed safe for now.

The committee would like to thank Town Manager Richard LaBelle, for assistance at committee meetings, and the Public Works Department Rodney Grant and crew for help with the summer workshop and for cemetery maintenance throughout the year. The Committee would also like to thank Grave Stone Matters, in and out of town volunteers, and the residents of Norridgewock for supporting the maintenance and upkeep of our eleven cemeteries.

PARKS COMMITTEE REPORT

We've had another busy year helping to bring great family-friendly events to the Norridgewock community. We appreciate all the support we receive to help promote our programming and bring stronger, low-cost events to townspeople and the region. The role of the Parks Committee continues to morph; we used to organize Oosoola Days and help with Oosoola Park. Now, we support activities and programming in all our parks: Oosoola, Ashley J. Wing Family Memorial Park (Martin Stream Rd.), Emery Town Square (Main St.), and Riverside Park (Maple St.). Each of these spaces provides us with different opportunities for community engagement and economic development, and we are excited for what the future holds with the ongoing commitment to invest in outdoor activities and recreation.



As you've likely read in other reports, we were heavily impacted by the December 2023 flooding. Oosoola Park was nearly all underwater, and Riverside Park wasn't much different. Repairs were made, the building was replaced, and grounds were improved. FEMA is reimbursing the Town for many of these expenses. It was an unfortunate occurrence, but one that we accept the risk of with being located along the river.

We'll try and keep this brief. Here are some of our wins for 2024:

- The new building at Ashley Wing Park was completed
- We finalized the purchase of adaptive playground equipment in Oosoola Park and plan to hold a ribbon cutting in the spring
- The kayak and paddleboard rental unit was installed; people are enjoying it
- The new swim docks were in for the first season; we're working to resolve vegetation in the area, and we're fairly confident it'll be better managed this year
- We've added surveillance, with the assistance of grants, at two parks, including the parking area by the boat launch
- The first graders at Mill Stream donated a Little Library for placement at Emery Town Square—what a nice and thoughtful addition!
- The TIF Committee supported the installation of a new sign for Oosoola Park (above). The new sign has interchangeable panels to promote the park, and it also matches other gateway signage



Programming notes for this last year:

- The music series (thanks, Franklin Savings Bank) was a hit! Expanded to eight weeks, we're looking forward to doing it again this July and August
- Oosoola Days appeared to have the strongest turnout in memory. Two great days between the airport, downtown, and Oosoola Park. The planes flew, the frogs raced, and we all had a great time!
- The Downtown Stroll and Tree Lighting event went off well. While the event attendance seemed down slightly, we celebrated that our notable lighted tractor parade grew even bigger. Many thanks to the Maine Antique Tractor Club and its members for their tremendous support. Above is a photo of the beautiful antique Christmas tree on display at the Historical Society.
- *None of this is possible without the support of voters and taxpayers, as well as the businesses and organizations within our community!*



We extend a huge thank you to Craig Jewell and *Short Circuit Electrical* for the generous donation of materials and labor this past fall. The Town paid to install 50-amp service to three locations in the Oosoola Park to support food trucks and other attractions. As a part of that project, the electrical panel was also raised. Craig thought the park would benefit from having a fourth 50-amp service, and he donated the work and materials associated with that. In the course of finishing up that project, he noticed an aged light near the park entrance. That, too, was replaced (and upgraded to LED) at no cost to the Town; Short Circuit Electrical donated it. *We surely are grateful for all the kindness that our parks receive from local people and businesses!*

We appreciate your continued support of our ever-expanding program offerings and thank you in advance for supporting our budget request. Without your support, we can't do what we can to help build our community into an even better place to call home!

The Norridgewock Water District is a quasi-municipal water utility. Because we are quasi-municipal, we are a not-for-profit company. NWD provides public drinking water and fire protection water supply to the community of Norridgewock. The goal of the District's Board of Trustees, superintendent, and personnel is to supply customers with safe water for domestic, municipal, and manufacturing purposes, and to provide reliable and dependable service.

Our distribution system consists of 10.42 miles of service pipe and covers 1.26 square miles (or 810 acres).

In 2024, we received a grant of up to \$1,050,700 from the Maine DOT (the Maine Infrastructure Adaptation Fund grant). Our local match is up to \$55,300. This grant arrived at a crucial time. The flood in December 2023 caused a leak/break in the water line near the riverbank on Upper Main Street. The riverbank is sliding into the river thus making the water line closer and closer to being exposed. When initially installed in 1953, this water line was on the left side of the road! Over the years, the Town had to move the road as the river eroded the bank. The grant funds were/will be used to install a new 12" water main from the pump house to beyond the cemetery on Upper Main Street. This project will be completed in two parts due to the weather. The initial part (from the pump house to the hydrant by the solar farm access road) was completed in December. The remainder of the project will be started as soon as the weather allows in the spring of 2025.

Repair work done this year: Approximately 900' of new water line was installed on the lower end of Main Street (project cost was \$1,030,000, and NWD received a "grant" of \$360,500 in loan forgiveness). We replaced a 6" valve and meter inside the pump house. We repaired water main breaks/leaks on Upper Main Street, Sophie May Lane, Roy Street, and Airport Road. We replaced curb stops on Main Street, Park Street, and Mechanic Street. We installed a new water service on Wilder Hill Road.

All water districts were required to do a Lead Service Line Inventory in 2024. While Norridgewock Water District never installed any lead service lines, we had to report to the State whether materials are known or unknown. Out of our 454 total services, we have 5 unknowns: 2 vacant houses in which we haven't been able to acquire access, and 3 vacant lots that will need to be inspected (these are locations where someone acquired a property and tore the house down and those services are shut off and inactive). We will update yearly on these unknowns.

We are still searching for a permanent office space to buy or build. We have been renting office and storage space for many years. Having a permanent office will save money.

Total revenue for 2024 = \$333,083.89 (this figure includes any unpaid & past due customer bills) *Preliminary pre-audit figures

Total expenses for 2024 = \$284,015.61 (includes MMBB & USDA RD bond payments of \$102,503.09) *Preliminary pre-audit figures

Due to extreme weather events in the past few years, our insurance rates have increased significantly.

Our office is located at 90 Mercer Rd., in the right front corner of Oosoola Country Store. Office hours are Wednesday and Thursday, 9am-1pm. Office staff can be reached by email any day of the week at norridgewockwaterdistrict@gmail.com. Our website is www.norridgewockwater.com

The Norridgewock Sportsmen Association (NSA) was incorporated in 1966 to promote social functions for persons who are interested in hunting, fishing, skiing, hiking, shooting and all outdoor sportsmen's activities. Developed and run by a group of dedicated volunteers, today, nearly 58 years later, it has changed a bit.

The majority of the efforts by NSA have been geared towards snowmobile and ATV enthusiasts. Hundreds of supportive landowners, businesses, and individuals support our program through land use, donations, and memberships. Recently, the change of use of our railroad system to a multi-use trail has added huge value to our community. The NSA is now responsible for just over 30 miles of snowmobile and/or ATV trails, to maintain and beautify, as well as 11 miles of multi-use trail. 

To the Citizens of the Town of Norridgewock:

It is a sincere honor to serve as the MSAD54 Superintendent of Schools and to again share with you an update on the district and the work we do day in and day out for our students and communities. As you know, MSAD 54 serves six strong communities: Canaan, Cornville, Mercer, Norridgewock, Skowhegan and Smithfield. As I have said before, the district has had a rich history of success because of the partnerships that exist between these communities, and I remain thankful for the leadership and strong working relationship that exists between the Town of Norridgewock and the District. High Quality Teaching and Learning: John Dewey said “Education is not preparation for life; education is life itself.” In MSAD 54, we are proud of the education we provide our kids from Pre-K through Grade 12. This year, Pre-K bussing has allowed us to offer comprehensive Pre-K education to all students in the district. In our elementary schools we’ve worked to provide students with access to meaningful learning opportunities designed to raise aspirations and expose our children to the world of possibilities. In Middle-School, we continue to push students to excel while providing supports for those students that need it. Our amazing staff are second to none in their effort to tie content learning with meaningful real-world experiences. At the High School, staff provide numerous pathways for students to find success. Our academic programs are robust and our highly trained staff are meeting the needs of students across the educational spectrum. Staff have expanded opportunities, especially in the trades. SCTC is one of the fastest growing tech centers in the state, with programs including Apprenticeships, Automotives, Business Academy, CDL, Career Exploration, Certified Nursing Assistant, Computer Science, Cooperative Education, Culinary, Digital Graphics, Early Education and Teaching, Electrical, EMT, Firefighting, Outdoor Leadership, Pre-Engineering, Residential Construction, and Welding Technology. In addition to these programs, SCTC has hired certified English and Mathematics instructors to support students in their pathways to graduation.

Budget: Although we anticipate that this year will be a particularly challenging year with respect to state funding and the budget, MSAD 54 remains committed to providing a high-quality education that is reasonable and responsible to the taxpayers. The Board of Directors has worked hard to balance the ever-greater needs of our children with the available resources that our communities most generously provide. Even with our District focus on meeting student needs, we have consistently managed to limit the impact on local property taxes. Over the past six years, district-wide local property impact has gone up just **2.142%** annually as a result of district budget increases.

Facilities: We are proud not only that we will be opening a state of the art elementary school in Skowhegan in the fall of 2025, but also that the building project will be completed without impact to local property taxpayers. Additionally, MSAD 54 has worked to ensure all facilities district-wide are well-kept; Mill Stream is certainly a great example of a quality school that has only been strengthened through the strong partnership that exists between the town and the district.





Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share several key accomplishments for our state from the previous year.

As Vice Chair of the Appropriations Committee, I have secured nearly \$580 million for 230 projects across all of Maine's 16 counties to promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; support law enforcement; improve public education and infrastructure; and protect our environment. As the new Congress begins, I am honored to be taking the helm of the Committee, the first Mainer to do so in nearly a century, and I remain committed to ensuring that federal spending produces real results for our state and nation.

Maine has the oldest average age in the county, which is why I have long prioritized health-focused legislative efforts. There were more than 1,860 health care bills introduced during the 118th Congress. Only 15 health care bills were signed into law, and I was a lead sponsor of five of them. These bills will enhance care for strengthened public health programs, and increased support for rural first responders.

Another important bill that I coauthored was the *Social Security Fairness Act*. Since 2003, when I led the first-ever Senate hearing on the Windfall Elimination Provision and the Government Pension Offset, I have sought to end these provisions of the *Social Security Act* that unfairly reduce Social Security benefits that public employees or their spouses have earned. I am pleased to say that with the passage of my bill, the *Social Security Fairness Act*, in December, public sector retirees will now receive the full Social Security benefits they have earned.

When the Maine way of life was under threat, I was certain to defend the interests of our state. I worked to protect Maine's potato farmers when the Department of Agriculture tried to reclassify the potato from a vegetable to a grain. I thwarted efforts to consolidate USPS mail operations at the Hampden postal facility, which would have disrupted mail delivery throughout our state. I sounded the alarm with leaders at the FBI and Departments of State and Treasury on the space of illicit marijuana growing operations that are destroying properties and providing refuge to foreign criminals in our state. Following damage to our working waterfronts after last winter's storms, I secured \$15 million to help fishing communities recover. I championed funding to support the Maine Air National Guard base, Bath Iron Works, and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard.

As of last December, I have cast more than 9,100 consecutive votes, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997. My ranking as the most bipartisan Senator reflects Maine's tradition of working with a spirit of cooperation and respect.



Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you well. It's an honor to continue serving as your representative in Congress, and I take the responsibility very seriously. Thank you for the opportunity to share an update on the work I've been doing for the people of the Second Congressional District.

Fisheries: This spring, the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) announced a gauge increase for lobsters caught in the Gulf of Maine beginning in January 2025. Maine fishermen warned that this decision is founded on incomplete and inaccurate data. Additionally, this gauge increase could put Mainers at a competitive disadvantage to Canadian fishermen with looser regulations. That's why I sent a letter to the ASMFC urging them to delay their decision until they can evaluate data with fishermen, whose proactive stewardship provides invaluable insight. I have also submitted an amendment to this year's funding bill that would block federal funding from being used to implement and enforce a gauge increase. Because of these efforts, the ASMFC made the decision to delay the implementation of this new requirement. I'll always stand with Maine lobstermen against unfair, unnecessary regulations that threaten their livelihoods and industry.

Veterans: The first meeting I attended as an elected official was with a large group of veterans and the former Director of the Maine Bureau of Veterans Services. We discussed a lot, but one issue rose above the rest: how little was being done for Maine veterans who needed treatment for mental health issues or substance use. At the time, there were no in-patient treatment beds in Maine, so veterans had to wait for a bed to open up at an out-of-state facility. Fast forward 10 years, through unending red tape, and I'm delighted to report we just broke ground on a treatment facility at the Togus VA Medical Center in Augusta. This was the direct result of the tireless advocacy of veterans from across our state — this win is theirs.

Postal Service: This spring, the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) announced plans to consolidate and move some processing operations from the Eastern Maine Processing & Distribution Center in Hampden to Scarborough. This would have caused significant mail delivery delays that disproportionately harm rural communities. That's why I introduced the *Timely Mail Delivery and Postal Services Protection Act*, which would have halted this planned consolidation across the

country. Following these efforts, the USPS announced they have scrapped their plan entirely. While this is a win for Maine, it is also evidence that we cannot become complacent. That's why I recently introduced the bipartisan *Postmaster General Reform Act*, which would establish term limits for the United States Postal Service's (USPS) postmaster general and require nominations to be confirmed by the Senate.

Regardless of the year, one of my top priorities is ensuring I'm accessible to you. My staff and I can help navigate federal programs; find resources in Maine; and resolve issues with Medicare, Social Security, the VA, and other federal agencies and programs. We are here to help:

2024 Sheriff's Office Annual Report

January 1, 2025 begins my 10th year as your Sheriff. I want to personally thank everyone for your continued support for the Somerset County Sheriff's Office. It is a privilege to serve the citizens of Somerset County.

The Office of Sheriff oversees the operations of the County Jail, law enforcement, court security, and civil process. Somerset County is approximately 4,000 square miles. The County is comprised of 27 towns, 6 plantations, and 83 unorganized townships. This year, I began my 2-year term as Immediate Past President of the Maine Sheriff's Association. I continue my appointment to the Board of Directors for the New England State Police Information Network (NESPIN). I am also a board member for the Statewide County Corrections Professional Standards Council.

I would like to report that the Somerset County Sheriff's Office continues to be an accredited law enforcement agency through the Maine Law Enforcement Accreditation Program. The Sheriff's Office law enforcement policies and procedures are best practice for the State of Maine. I want to take this opportunity to thank staff and Deputies for their diligent efforts to obtain this accreditation.

In 2024, the Somerset County Sheriff's Office added two School Resource Officers (SRO). We provide an SRO to SAD 59 (Madison) and to SAD 54 (Canaan and Norridgewock).

The Sheriff's Office collaborates with Somerset Public Health to provide a Care Coordinator for Substance Use Disorder. When Deputies respond to incidents that have addiction related components, they now have an imbedded caseworker that can process referrals for treatment. The Sheriff's Office procured a drone, through grant funding, to assist Deputies with the investigation of crime scenes and motor vehicle crashes.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

The Patrol division is comprised of 14 Patrol Deputies and 3 Sergeants. Through funding from the State of Maine, we have 2 Deputies dedicated to patrolling the unorganized townships. The Patrol division is overseen by a Lieutenant. The Patrol Division conducted 1,275 traffic stops and covered 987 reportable accidents. The Patrol Division arrested/summoned 835 individuals in Somerset County. The Sheriff's Office assigns one Deputy per shift to patrol the Town of Madison. We have a 32-hour Secretary/Dispatcher assigned to Madison. We had a total of four Deputies graduate from the 45th and 46th Basic Law Enforcement Program (BLETP) at the Maine Criminal Justice Academy this year.

The Criminal division is comprised of 4 Detectives, 1 Domestic Violence Investigator assigned to the Somerset County District Attorney's Office and is overseen by a Lieutenant. The Sheriff's Office continues to partner with the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency (MDEA) to have an agent assigned to the Criminal Division. Presently, that position is not filled. The Sheriff's Office has one trained accident re-constructionist

along with one forensic mapper. The Sheriff's Office has two canines, one assigned to each division.

Throughout 2024, the Sheriff's Office Criminal Division investigated a large volume of illicit drug trafficking activities. This year, the Criminal Division obtained 63 search warrants and charged 68 people with illicit drug charges. The Criminal Division charged 60 people with crimes such as, burglary, theft, sexual assault, fraud, etc. Between January and December, the Criminal Division executed 22 illegal marijuana cultivation drug search warrants. These warrants have been executed in the Towns of Cornville, Norridgewock, Madison, Anson, Solon, Ripley, St. Albans, Skowhegan, and Canaan. In 2024, the Criminal Division seized approximately 28,000 marijuana plants, approximately 250 pounds of processed marijuana, approximately \$50,000 in cash, and 5 motor vehicles.

In 2024, the Crimes Against Persons Detective investigated 27 sex offense complaints. 19 of those cases involved child sexual abuse where forensic interviewing was utilized. Detective Jeremy Leal is a Children's Advocacy Center forensic interviewer. As a result of these investigations and working with the District Attorney's Office prosecuting these cases, we were able to get substantial sentences in a number of child abuse cases. The Sheriff's Office Criminal Division tracks individuals who are required by law to register as sex offenders. 3 individuals were charged/arrested with Sex Offender Registration Notification Act violations.

JAIL

The Somerset County Jail, when operating at full capacity, operates with 36 budgeted Correctional Officers, 8 Shift Supervisors, 3 cooks, 12 program and support staff, and 9 administrative staff. The Somerset County Jail is now 17 years old. The County Jail is nationally accredited through the American Correctional Association and is operating under national best practice standards. The County Jail is also Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) certified. In 2024, the Somerset County Jail recorded 1,319 total bookings, a 3.2% increase since 2023. We are currently still working with the State of Maine in administering Sublocaide to inmates who identify with an Opioid Use Disorder. The Somerset County Jail has a robust programs division. Services provided include parenting classes, alcohol treatment, education and mental health counselling. In 2024, we collaborated with Somerset Public Health, funded by New Balance, to have inmates work growing a variety of vegetables that get processed on-site by our kitchen workers and distributed to local schools.

CIVIL PROCESS

In 2024, the Somerset County Sheriff's Office Civil Deputies received 1,325 papers to process and serve. That is a 23% decrease from 2023.


CALLS FOR SERVICE

- In 2024, the Sheriff's Office received 17,479 calls for service from our residents. This represents a 4.30% decrease from 2023.

- During 2024, the Sheriff's Office responded to 2,145 calls for service from the Town of Norridgewock, which represents a 0.5% increase from 2023. These calls included 186 motor vehicle accidents, 444 motor vehicle stops, 78 calls requesting citizen assistance, 44 domestic disturbances, as well as calls for burglary, theft, criminal threatening, assault, harassment, welfare checks, and other requests for police services.

SOMERSET COUNTY

Maine

Somerset County Government provides everyday public safety services to the residents and visitors throughout our 4,095 square miles. Nearly 80% of our employees are directly involved in taking calls for service, responding to those calls, prosecuting violations of the law, and providing incarceration and corrections. Furthermore, County Government secures property rights through the Registry of Deeds and protects family rights in Probate Court.

In a partnership with each of our towns, plantations and townships, Somerset County seeks to strike a balance of services and costs to the taxpayer. The budget put into effect July 1, 2024, was a modest 3.1% increase over the past year thanks to the diligent work of Department Heads, County Commissioners, and the Budget Committee.

Throughout the State there was significant turnover in County Commissioners in 2024. In Somerset, however, we were fortunate to return Robert Sezak in District One and Cyp Johnson in District Two through re-election. Sitting Commissioners Scott Seekins of District Three, Joel Stetkis in District Four, and John Alsop in District Five compose a board of experienced leadership for the County.

A priority for these Commissioners has been providing funding to towns and agencies that are on the front lines of community service. Early in 2024, the Commissioners provided \$108,500 in Community Benefit Funds to towns impacted by the significant flooding in the December 2023 storms. Since the Fall of 2023, over 35 entities have received \$330,000 in Community Benefit Grants impacting 20 different Somerset communities. These matching grants have spurred over \$700,000 in local development.

In 2024, the County formed an official partnership with Somerset Public Health to provide a Care Coordinator within the Sheriff's Office and County Jail to assist with recovery of substance abuse issues. This trained

professional processes referrals from Sheriff's Deputies for individuals and families in need of resources, and coordinates with Jail Administration to connect inmates to services within the facility and refer and make appointments to community resources upon release.

This past year, the County also embarked on a study of Animal Control resources in Somerset. Pulling together a committee that included ACO's for various towns, law enforcement, Commissioners, Town Managers, and Select Board members, the study has compiled pay rates for Animal Control Officers and is assessing the capacity of the Somerset Humane Society's shelter in Skowhegan. This ongoing study seeks to make necessary improvements to the area's Animal Control infrastructure.

While staffing remains a challenge in the current economy, Somerset headed into 2025 with a workforce near full capacity for the first time in over a decade. On behalf of all County employees, it is our pleasure to serve our communities.

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate all monies received in 2025 from the Treasurer, State of Maine snowmobile registration refund program to the Norridgewock Sportsmen Association for the maintenance of its system or network of snowmobile trails, with the condition that those trails are open in the snow season to the public for outdoor recreational purposes at no charge, and to authorize the Select Board to enter into an agreement with the Association under such terms and conditions as the Select Board deems advisable for that purpose.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to spend any amount not to exceed three-twelfths (3/12) of the budgeted amount in each category of the 2025 annual budget during the period from January 1, 2026, until the date of the 2026 Annual Town Meeting.

- C. Interest will be charged at 7.5%, the maximum rate as set forth by the State of Maine, beginning September 16, 2025, or 41 days after commitment, whichever is later.
- D. All taxes outstanding as of January 1, 2026, will be listed in the Town's Annual Report.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to set the interest rate to be paid by the Town on abated taxes at 3.5% for the period of assessment and to authorize such interest paid or abatements granted to be appropriated from the Property Tax Overlay Account or, if necessary, from Unassigned Fund balance (surplus).

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to dispose of property acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes and/or sewer user fees via quitclaim deed by either: (a) offering the property to the former owner(s) or, if deceased, to his/her/their heirs/devisees/personal representative for a price equal to all outstanding taxes and sewer user fees, interest, fees, and costs; or (b) using the process authorized by 36 M.R.S. § 943-C, provided that if the Select Board is unable to list or sell the property as required by 36 M.R.S. § 943-C(3), the Select Board may, pursuant to 36 M.R.S. § 943-C(4-A), either sell the property through a competitive sealed bid process in which a notice of advertising the sale of the property shall be published at least twice in a newspaper of general circulation in the county or through such other method as the Select Board deems

to be in the best interest of the Town. For sales other than to the former owner, excess sale proceeds, as defined in 36 M.R.S. §943-C, shall be returned to the former owner.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Treasurer, after Select Board approval, to file a waiver of automatic foreclosure at the Registry of Deeds, pursuant to 36 M.R.S. § 944, on real estate that may be burdensome for the Town.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to dispose of Town-owned personal property with a value, in its judgment, of more than \$500.00, by a process of sealed bids; provided, however, that (a) the Select Board may dispose of Fire Department equipment, excluding trucks, on such terms and conditions as it deems advisable; and (b) if bids are not received for property that is put out to bid, the Select Board may dispose of property as it deems advisable.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to dispose of Town-owned personal property, with a value, in its judgment, of \$500.00 or less, under such terms and conditions as it deems advisable.

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Select Board to negotiate, execute and administer lease agreements with individuals for use of Town-owned land for mowing/haying, cultivating, and crop growth, subject to all legally required or advisable insurance and environmental provisions.

Article 39. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board and Treasurer, on behalf of the Town, to apply for and accept State, federal and non-profit organization grants, donations or other revenues, on behalf of the Town for municipal purposes, including when necessary, the authority to sign grant contracts, documents and or other paperwork and accept the conditions that accompany grant funds, and to appropriate and expend grant funds and or other funds for authorized purposes, as the Select Board deems in the best interests of the Town during the upcoming fiscal year.

Article 40. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to appropriate funds from the Omnibus Development Program Transit Oriented Development and Natural Gas Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District for the purpose of funding projects permitted under the TIF Development Program for the Fiscal Year 2025, with consideration given to the expenditure recommendations of the TIF Advisory Committee.


Article 41. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate any interest accrued on a reserve account for the same purpose for which the reserve account was established.

Article 42. To see if the Town will vote to change the Library Trustee term length to three years, beginning with terms expiring at the 2026 Annual Town Meeting.

Article 43. Shall an ordinance entitled “2025 Amendments to the Town of Norridgewock Shoreland Zoning Ordinance” be enacted?
